PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT CIRCLE

Big developments! Members who intend to buy or share a lot at CGEV and are demonstrating or developing the financial capacity to do so will begin to meet as a group in early August, under the auspices of P&D. For the first time, we are going to know who is likely "in" and what kind of money we are going to be able to call on for the infrastructure investments to enable us to begin building houses in turn. Dedicated members have been surveying likely "Grounders" — formerly "Groundmakers," formerly "Groundbreakers," formerly "First Wave Working Group" — in preparation for this meeting. Please be in touch ASAP with Anthony or Momo for P&D or **Kara McCormack** for the survey proper if plan to be a "Grounder" and haven't made your intentions known.

"The experience of hearing the chorus of bees and watching as the ground seems to move with thousands of critters is a life-changing one. Watching nature's cycles has grounded me, helping me realize how interconnected humans are with nature. I mentioned this once at a farm lunch (a weekly event I highly recommend!), sharing how the experience of being fed by the land and, in turn, feeding the mosquitos, opened my eyes to the fact that I have a place in the cycle of nature and on the land.

We continue to manage the rezoning of the land back to R1 conventional zoning to enable us to develop an alternative site plan using the County's new Flexible Development – Conservation Cluster framework. The County Planning Board hearing is August 7. The County Board of Commissioners approval (we trust!) will be September 5. In anticipation, we continue to work out a Conservation Cluster-based site plan and garner infrastructure cost estimates; a number of potential site contractors are interested.

Thanks to the good initiative of Randy Dodd and Becky Laskody, the Finance and Legal Subcircle is being revivified, and another key job is being better addressed: more systematic sequencing and coordinating all of the many specific tasks that need to be carried out in order to move forward in the high gear now needed.

Nonetheless, July was a great month for taking it a little easier out on the land, in the shade of the Grandmother Oak for a picnic farm lunch, jaunts down to the wetlands to be snuck up on by an otter, to pausing with awe at the incredible proliferation of spiders and their webs, including the yellow orb weavers in the caterpillar tunnels!

Did you know that a spider's web is an extension of their mind? Keep that in mind when you encounter them and be extra mindful to minimize harm to their webs.

We'll say goodbye to our summer intern, Riley, after the tomato canning party on August 4. She was here for two months during her summer break from college in Colorado. The farm crew has especially appreciated her affinity for cherry tomato harvests, onion peeling, and sharing local Piedmont knowledge about the animals and plants on the land.
